POLICY:

It is the policy of the Pathways Board that the recipient, parent of a minor or guardian shall be informed when the recipient is ready for a change, release, discharge or has received maximum benefit from the current program.

The following standards shall be adhered to:

- A. A recipient's written plan of service shall include a specific date or dates when the overall plan, and any of its subcomponents, will be formally reviewed for possible modification or revision.
- B. Changes to the plan of service shall be made as part of the person-centered planning process. A recipient shall be informed when it is determined that he or she is ready for change, release, discharge, or has received the maximum benefit from current treatment. Required written notice about the change and how to request a review of this change shall be provided according to agency procedures.
- C. If the recipient is not satisfied with his or her individual plan of services, the recipient, the person authorized by the recipient to make decisions regarding the individual plan of services, the guardian of the recipient, or the parent of a minor recipient may make a request for a review to the designated individual in charge of implementing the plan.
- D. The review shall be completed within 10 days and will be conducted according to the agency's process and time frames for a local appeal.

PROCEDURES

- A. The primary clinician will:
 - 1. Verbally inform the recipient, parent, or guardian about:
 - a. The proposed change, release, or discharge, or that the recipient has received the maximum benefit from current treatment;
 - b. The justification for such change or discharge;
 - c. The process for requesting a review of this determination.
 - 2. Provide required written notice, according to agency procedures, about review options within Pathways and the Department of Health and Human Services.
