

Pathways Community Mental Health CEO Announces Retirement

Pathways CEO, Mary Swift, has announced that she will be retiring April 30, 2021 following 28 years of services with Pathways, a public mental health system that directly provides services to individuals with developmental disabilities, children with severe emotional disturbances, and adults with severe mental illness in Alger, Delta, Luce and Marquette counties.

Throughout Mary's career, her priority has always been focused on the individuals receiving services. Her commitment to the health and wellness of those we serve can be seen through programs she has supported and assured were implemented within the Pathways catchment area. Mary's 28 year career at Pathways has included her providing direct services, overseeing the services being provided, protecting the rights of those receiving services, and managing the overall community mental health system for the Pathways' catchment area. The actual positions included Case Manager for the Family Support Services, Program Supervisor for the Family Support Services, Supervisor of the Recipient Rights Office, Chief Operating Officer, and for the past 6 years, and which she is now retiring from, Pathways Chief Executive Officer.
